Reception Curriculum

Schools are required to follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum (EYFS) during the Reception year. The children's learning is achieved through carefully planned activities linked to the objectives in the EYFS Curriculum. These activities are very practical and enable children to learn through exciting first hand experiences. The EYFS Curriculum is split into the following areas:



Communication and Language

Develop children's ability to express themselves fully, whilst taking into account the views of others.

Physical Development

Opportunities for children to be active to enable them to improve their co-ordination, control, manipulation and movement.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Building positive relationships and developing independence and confidence. Also the ability to self regulate and manage their emotions

Literacy

Encourage children to link sounds and letters and develop children's reading and writing skills.

Mathematics

Opportunity to develop skills and understanding in counting, numbers, calculating, shapes, spaces and measures.

Understanding the World

Finding out about people, places, family history and the environment.

Expressive Arts and Design

Exploration of a wide range of media and materials. This area includes art, music, dance, role play and imaginative play.

The EYFS profile



- •Throughout the year there will be opportunities to speak to Miss Pettit about your child's progress.
- •We will regularly upload work or observations on to tapestry. You can add to tapestry too!
- •There will be two parents evenings throughout the year and an end of year report. There is also an optional parents evening to discuss your child's report if you would like one.
- •It is statutory that school will report whether your child has met the Early learning goals. They will either be emerging or expected for each of the 17 Early learning goals.

Each day there will be a mixture of:

*Whole Class Work (number rhymes and songs, counting, games, listening to stories, learning and talking about number facts, shared writing activities).

- * Exploration and Play.
- * Child Initiated Learning Plan, do, review This is where children access different learning areas within the environment. This is a great opportunity for children to apply and consolidate prior learning.

First day of school is Tuesday 3rd September 2024.
